MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

The new birth - growing to maturity

One of the most beautiful joys and miracles in life is the birth of a child. The child's parents look forward to its arrival. There is much excitement they get things ready at home. Then the long-awaited day arrives. The contractions start. The delivery happens, and the baby is born. Congratulations!

But that's not the end. It's only the beginning of a long process. The baby needs the care to develop physically, and this involves regular feeding, nappy-changing, personal care, and keeping it safe from all injury and danger. When the new-born cries, it needs comfort. When it's tired, it needs to be rocked to sleep. When it's unwell, it requires special care. Such great care and attention usually put enormous demands on the parents who may not have much rest and sleep for many days, weeks and months. It's not easy to provide all the after-care that a new-born infant needs.

Babe's in Christ

Well, in the same way, it is not easy to provide all the spiritual after-care that a babe in Christ needs.
