Prayer Points and Information

Continue to pray for those who are currently suffering with ill health, or who have been undergoing tests and procedures.

Pray for the wellbeing of families in our church, and for increased contact with families in the local neighbourhood. Pray too as we begin to prepare to operate a Foodbank cafe in the church.

Give thanks that Britain ranks first in the world for quality end of life care. Pray that our Government will do more to promote hospice and palliative care as the most compassionate approach to people who are suffering.

BMS World Mission has a long history of seeking to address issues surrounding healing and health, sending health professionals and others across the world to engage in health ministries. Pray for the six mission workers at the Guinebor II Hospital in Chad, a country in desperate need of medical care (Chad has the second highest maternal mortality rate and the sixth highest infant mortality rate in the world). Pray for good progress with the new maternal health project being prepared for the hospital, including the construction of a long overdue maternal health centre. In addition, with no end in sight to the escalating humanitarian crisis in Syria, pray for BMS' Lebanese partner as it continues to provide medical care, as well as other forms of assistance, in highly challenging conditions. Pray for the work of the Haiti Hospital Appeal and, in particular, for the volunteer co-ordination role played by BMS volunteer Laura Reed.
