A prayer for wetlands: 'Creator God, we praise you for the beauty and rich biological diversity of Earth's wetlands: home to an abundance of plants and living creatures, supporting the livelihoods of people living nearby, and providing clean water and protection from flooding. We pray for all who work to protect wildlife species threatened by increased human development, such as agriculture and industry, that is taking over major areas of wetlands, causing pollution and altering natural water levels. Amen.'
